

Minutes of 12th Annual General Meeting of the LLIMEYS – Friends of Llanymynech Limeworks Heritage Area - held on Saturday, 9 July, 2022 at 2pm in the Limeworks Stables

3. Minutes of meeting held on 23 May were read and accepted
4. Chair's report: JZ's full report is in the Newsletter. In summary, she commented on the last 2 years when most activities were put on hold although the maintenance team were able to continue their work. Towards the end of 2021 guided walk bookings resumed and filming by S4C took place. New interpretation boards were purchased with Shaun Burkey's help to replace ones which had deteriorated. A new board was erected next to the car park to explain the sculpture. Joan thanked Glyn for his work as treasurer and Bob for taking over the role. She also thanked Tony, Martyn, Bob and Nick for their work on the site and Dickon for the art work for the new interpretation board before announcing her intention to stand down as Chair
